



Greg Kaplan is a Professor in the Kenneth C. Griffin Department of Economics and the College at the University of Chicago (since 2016). He is also a Co-Editor of the Journal of Political Economy. Previously, he was a Professor at Princeton University. Prior to this, he was an Assistant Professor at Princeton University and the University of Pennsylvania.

Kaplan earned a Ph.D. from New York University in 2009. His research spans macroeconomics, monetary economics, labor economics and applied microeconomics. He has published extensively in all the major journals in economics. In 2015 he received the prestigious Alfred Sloan Research Fellowship and in 2019 he was awarded the Central Banking Prize for Economics in Central Banking for his paper Monetary Policy According to HANK. He is an elected fellow of the Econometric Society since 2021.
